MINNESOTA GENERAL ELECTION Tuesday, November 5, 2024

Important deadlines:

- It's recommended to **register** before Election Day, but you can also register on Election Day.
- Pre-registration deadline is October 15. Registration then temporarily closes and opens again on Election Day. You can register at your polling place on Election Day. See Early Voting and Same Day Registration information below.
- To vote by mail, you must submit your application for a mail ballot by November 3.*
- To vote **early and in person,** go to your County Clerk's office from **September 20 to November 4.** (See early voting information below.)

*Mail-in ballots must be received by Election Day or returned in person by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day to the office that sent your ballot or a designated drop box: https://www.sos.state.mn.us/elections-voting/other-ways-to-vote/ballot-drop-box-locations/. STEP 1: REGISTER TO VOTE

REGISTER ONLINE:

To register online, visit: https://www.sos.state.mn.us/elections-voting/register-to-vote. You will need either your social security number, MN driver's license, or MN ID card. If you don't have a Minnesota ID or social security number, you can still register to vote by mail or in person. You cannot use a Tribal ID to register online. Online voter registration ends at 11:59 PM on Tuesday, Oct. 15.

REGISTER BY MAIL OR IN PERSON:

Access and print the voter registration form, available at: https://www.sos.state.mn.us/elections-voting/register-to-vote/register-on-paper/ or at your County Clerk's office. Fill out the paper registration form and mail it to your County Clerk's office or drop it off in person. You must include a copy of an ID with your current name & current address. You can use a MN driver's license or MN state ID card. You cannot use a Tribal ID card to register by mail. The deadline to register before Election Day is October 15. Your County Clerk's office must receive the form no later than 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, October 15.

REGISTRATION UPDATES:

You must re-register each time you change your address, change names, or do not vote at least once during a four-year period. Update your record by completing a new application. You can check your registration status online at mnvotes.org. If you are unsure, it is okay to fill out another registration application.

NO PERMANENT ADDRESS:

If you do not have a permanent address, you can still register to vote by providing the location of where you sleep as your address (if not outside), or a description of the location (if you sleep outside). If you register before Election Day using an outdoor location as your residence, you will be asked to swear under oath on Election Day that you live at the location. If you want to register on Election Day, you will need another registered voter from your precinct to go with you to the polling place to confirm where you live.

STEP 2: GO VOTE

EARLY VOTING:

Every voter has at least one location where they can vote early in person with an absentee ballot. For a list of locations, visit: https://www.sos.state.mn.us/elections-voting/other-ways-to-vote/voting-locations-before-election-day/. You also can also vote early by mail, which requires a witness when you complete your ballot. The witness must be either a registered Minnesota voter or a notary.

SAME-DAY REGISTRATION:

If you did not register to vote by October 15, then you can register on Election Day, November 5, at your polling location and vote on the same day. ID Required to Register AND Vote on the Same Day

In order to register and vote on the same day, you must bring proof of your current residence. To show proof of residence, you can either:

- **1. Use a current ID.** Bring an ID with your current name and current address (not expired). This ID can be a MN driver's license, learner's permit, or ID; or a receipt for any of these; or a Tribal ID that includes your name, address, photo, and signature; **or**
- **2.** Use an expired or outdated ID + additional documents to prove where you live. Bring an ID (that can be expired), including an out-of-state driver's license, ID card, U.S. passport, Tribal ID, MN school student ID, or U.S. military or veteran ID, PLUS a document with your current name & address.

This additional document can include:

- A utility bill, rent or mortgage statement, a phone bill, or banking or credit card statement (dated within 30 days of Nov. 5 Election Day);
- A residential lease or rent agreement that is valid through Nov. 5 Election Day;
- A current student fee statement if you are enrolled in college or university.

RETURNING BALLOTS FOR OTHERS:

You can drop off ballots for up to three other voters. You will need to show identification with name and signature when doing so. Agent delivery is also available for people in special situations, such as living in a nursing home or hospitalized.
