
ALASKA GENERAL ELECTION

Tuesday, November 5, 2024 Winners serve as our elected officials.

Important deadlines:

- It's recommended to register before Election Day, but you can also register in person on Election Day.
- To register online, complete the online application by October 6.
- To register by mail, postmark your paper voter registration form by October 6.
- To request an absentee ballot, the County Clerk's office must receive your absentee ballot request by October 26.
- When voting with an absentee ballot, postmark your completed ballot by November 5 at 8:00 p.m.
- To vote early and in person, go to your County Clerk's office from October 21 to November 5.

STEP 1: REGISTER TO VOTE

REGISTER IN PERSON:

Go to your county Division of Motor (DMV) office, Vocational Rehabilitation office, participating Tribal government office, Legislative Information office, United States Armed Forces Voter Assistance office; political party office, public assistance agency, city or borough Clerk's office, participating public library, or voter registrar to register in person.

REGISTER ONLINE:

To regsiter online, visit: <u>https://voterregistration.alaska.gov/</u>. Your name, social security number, driver's license number, and date of birth must match information on file with the Alaska DMV. You must register by October 6 for the General Election. If you don't have a DMV-issued driver's license or ID, you must register by mail or in person.

REGISTER BY MAIL:

Print a copy of this form: <u>https://www.elections.alaska.gov/doc/forms/C03.pdf</u>. Send your completed form and a copy of either your current driver's license, state ID, passport, or birth certificate by mail to a Regional Elections Office.

SAME-DAY REGISTRATION:

Alaska offers same-day voter registration during presidential elections. The 2024 General Election is a presidential election, so you can register to vote and vote on Election Day. Same-day registrants are required to present an Alaska driver's license or valid form of ID to vote.

STEP 2: GO VOTE RANKED CHOICE VOTING (GENERAL ELECTION ONLY)

Alaska has a ranked choice voting system for the general election. This means that voters instead of picking one candidate, will rank the listed candidates in order of their preference. You may rank as few or as many of the candidates as you would like. Completely fill in no more than one oval for each candidate or column (see example below). VOTER ID REQUIREMENTS:

Voters must present a valid government ID with your name on it, such as a driver's license, passport, hunting or fishing license, or Tribal ID card from a federally recognized Tribe. If you do not have a valid ID, you may present a curent utility bill or paycheck, government check, or bank statement or other government-issued document. These documents must have your current residence address. LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE:

Alaska provides translated written and oral election materials for languages that are historically written and unwritten. Language assistance is available at any stage of the electoral process in an Alaska Native language. On-call interpreters are available on Election Day in addition to other resources such as billingual poll workers and translators.
