### **ELECTION DATES AND DEADLINES**

### MICHIGAN GENERAL ELECTION

#### Tuesday, November 5, 2024

Winners serve as our elected officials.

### Important deadlines:

- To register online or by mail, registration forms must be submitted online or postmarked by October 21.
- From October 22 through Election Day, voters may only register by visiting their local clerk's office to register in person with proof of residency.
- Mail-in ballots must be returned in person by 8:00 p.m. or received in the mail by 8:00 p.m. on November 5.
- Absentee ballot requests made online or by mail must be made by 5:00 p.m. on **November 1**.
- Requests made in-person at the clerk's office must be made by 4:00 p.m. on **November 4**.
- Eligible voters who are not registered can register <u>and</u> complete an absentee ballot in person until 8:00 p.m. on **November 5**.

# **STEP 1: REGISTER TO VOTE**

### **REGISTER ONLINE:**

To register online, visit: <u>https://mvic.sos.state.mi.us/RegisterVoter/Index</u>. You will need the last 4-digits of your Social Security Number, Michigan driver's license number, or Michigan ID number. *Must register by October 21.* After October 21, voters must register in person and present proof of residency at their local clerk's office.

#### **REGISTER BY MAIL:**

Print registration form: <u>https://www.michigan.gov/sos/elections/voting/voters.</u> Fill out the form and mail/ email it to your County Clerk's office. You will need a Michigan driver's license number or Michigan ID number <u>OR</u> the last 4-digits of your Social Security Number.

Mailed or scanned and emailed applications should be submitted by **October 21.** Mailed applications must be postmarked by **October 21** and received by **November 5 at 8:00 p.m.** 

#### EXPANDED EARLY VOTING AND SAME-DAY REGISTRATION:

Expanded early voting is available in many counties from **October 26 to November 3.** County Clerks may offer more days. To find the nearest early voting location go to: <u>https://www.michigan.gov/sos/elections/voting/early-in-person-voting</u>.

## **STEP 2: GO VOTE**

#### VOTER ID REQUIREMENTS:

You will be asked to show ID when you check in to vote. ID types you can use to check in are:

- Driver's license or personal ID card
- Federal or state government-issued photo ID
- U.S. passport

- Military identification card with photo
- Student identification with photo
- Tribal identification card with photo

**IF YOU DO NOT HAVE ONE OF THE ABOVE, YOU CAN STILL VOTE.** Michigan election law anticipates that not all voters will have picture ID. Voters who do not have acceptable picture ID or forgot to bring acceptable picture ID to the polls can vote like any other voter by signing an affidavit. Expect a poll worker to ask you to sign a form before you vote that explains you didn't have an ID. Your ballot will be counted on Election Day. (https://mvic.sos.state.mi.us/Home/VoteInPerson)
