ELECTION DATES AND DEADLINES

WISCONSIN GENERAL ELECTIONS

Tuesday, November 5, 2024

Winners serve as our elected officials.



Important deadlines:

- To **register online or by mail**, completed voter registration forms must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. on **October 16** or postmarked by October 16.
- If you want to **vote by mail**, you must submit your absentee ballot request to be received by **October 31** at 5:00 p.m. (whether mailed or brought to the County Clerk's office).
- If you vote by mail, your ballot must be received by the County Clerk's office (whether mailed or brought in person) by **November 5** by 8:00 p.m.
- To **vote early and in person**, contact your municipal County Clerk's office for the dates and hours for in-person absentee voting where you live.
- There is same-day voter registration in Wisconsin, so you can register to vote and vote on Election Day, November 5.

MAKE YOUR VOTE COUNT!

Step 1: Are you eligible to vote?

Generally, you are eligible if you are:

- ✓ At least 18 (by Election Day)
- ✓ A citizen of the United States
- ✓ A Wisconsin resident at least 28 days before the election

If you have a felony conviction, you can vote after completing your sentence.

Step 2: Are you registered to vote with current information?

You **MUST** be registered to vote! Check to see if you are registered and if your information is up to date at: <https://myvote.wi.gov/en-us/My-Voter-Info>.

STEP 1: REGISTER TO VOTE

PROOF OF RESIDENCE IS REQUIRED TO REGISTER TO VOTE:

All voters must provide a Proof of Residence document when registering to vote. If you register to vote by mail, in-person at the clerk's office, or at a polling place on Election Day, you need to provide a Proof of Residence document. A Proof of Residence document can be a hardcopy document or displayed on an electronic device. Visit <https://elections.wi.gov/Register#230548828-870893236> for a full list of acceptable Proof of Residence documents.

YOU CAN REGISTER IN PERSON AT YOUR MUNICIPAL CLERK'S OFFICE OR YOU CAN:

REGISTER ONLINE:

To register online, go to: <https://myvote.wi.gov/en-us/Register-To-Vote>. Voters who are able to match their name, date of birth, Wisconsin driver's license/state ID number, and address with the Wisconsin Department of Motor Vehicles can register to vote online through October 16.

REGISTER BY MAIL:

You can register by mail through October 16, 2024. Completed registration forms (<https://elections.wi.gov/wec-form/voter-registration-application-el-131-131h-131s>) should be mailed to your municipal clerk. You can start your voter registration form online at myvote.wi.gov. Your form must be printed, signed, and mailed or delivered to your Municipal Clerk. If you are registering by mail, you can use any type of Proof of Residence except a residential lease.

STEP 2: GO VOTE

ABSENTEE VOTING:

All registered voters are eligible to vote absentee. You can request an absentee ballot on myvote.wi.gov or make a request to your Municipal Clerk in writing or online using the Application for Absentee Ballot (https://www.rfcity.org/DocumentCenter/View/5025/EL-121-Application-for-Absentee-Ballot-Fillable_0-1) or statement containing all the information required on the form. The request must be received by the office of the municipal clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. on October 31.

Absentee ballots must arrive by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day to be counted. The ballot can either be returned by mail, dropped off at your clerk's office, or taken to your polling place or absentee counting location on Election Day.

EARLY VOTING AND SAME-DAY REGISTRATION:

Early voting is available in the form of in-person absentee voting. Each city, village, and town is responsible for setting the dates and hours of in-person absentee voting in their municipality. Early voting cannot begin earlier than 14 days before an election. Election Day registration is available at your polling place.

WISCONSIN NATIVES VOTE

VOTER ID REQUIREMENTS:

You will need to show an original copy of an acceptable photo ID to vote at your polling place or to cast an in-person absentee ballot at your municipal clerk's office. You will also be required to provide a photocopy of your ID to cast an absentee ballot by mail. You may get a free ID for voting from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation: <https://wisconsindot.gov/Pages/dmv/license-drvs/how-to-apply/id-card.aspx>. **More information on Voter ID requirements can be found here:** <https://elections.wi.gov/photoid#230548828-165913763>.

RETURNING BALLOTS FOR OTHERS:

Voters should plan to return their absentee ballot by mail or by delivering it themselves to their municipal clerk's office, polling place, or other location designated by the municipal clerk. Voters with disabilities have the right to assistance returning their ballot from a person of their choice (other than their employer or union representative). Powers of Attorney may assist you with registering to vote and voting your ballot but they must be a family member and cannot register or vote on your behalf without your presence. They may request your absentee ballot on your behalf.
